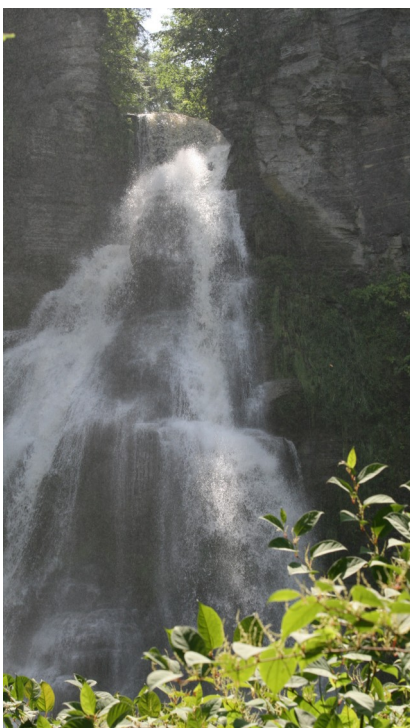


## COME HAVE SOME FUN!

# HIGH ADVENTURE PILOT PROGRAM—JET SKIS

---

## How the Program is set up:

Scouts will be able to take up to 3 merit badges while they are at Camp Barton. The merit badge sessions will be in the morning, from 9 AM until 12 PM.

Following lunch on Monday, there will be the first of two 4 hour training sessions to meet the NY State boating requirement necessary to operate a PWC. The class will be offered by the Ithaca Sail and Power Squadron. The second session will be Tuesday afternoon from 1 to 5 PM.

Upon completion of and passing the exam, the Scout will be awarded a certificate allowing them to operate a PWC. The Scout will be able to ride under supervision on Wednesday to Friday afternoon.

Lack of safety and reckless endangerment of individuals and/or PWC will not be tolerated. Any incident deemed unsafe will forfeit your right to operate a PWC. There will be no refund.

## How the Class will be chosen:

Each PWC class will be made up of 30 Scouts. A Scout must be 14 years of age to be able to take the class. The class will be filled from all applicants by age and date of application received. The class will be filled starting with 17 year olds, followed by 16 year olds, etc.

## Adults are welcome to take the class.

Adults can take the certification class and receive the Boating Safety with PWC certificate.

## Already have the PWC certification?

Any Scout or Adult who already has a Boating Safety Certificate with PWC must bring it to camp to ride the PWCs. A fee will be charged to use the PWC. Based on the number of individuals who already have certification, sign ups may have to be taken. The PWCs will be available in the mornings, from 9 AM until 12 PM, and Monday and Tuesday afternoons, under the supervision of the PWC instructor. The PWCs are reserved Wednesday to Friday afternoons for the scouts.
