Welcome to the 2019 National Camping School (NCS) at Harry S Fraizer Scout Reservation at Camp Crooked Creek near Shepherdsville KY! On behalf of the camping school faculty, we eagerly look forward to having you with us at Camp Crooked Creek. The course liaison for this school is Sarah Flowers (Sarah.Flowers@Scouting.org). Please do not hesitate to contact either Sarah or myself if you have any questions prior to the school. The following information will help you prepare for NCS.

<u>Before you arrive</u>: An <u>Annual BSA medical examination and health record</u>, completed within the past 12 months, is required and must be completed <u>prior</u> to your arrival. Please bring the completed form with you. If you do not have this required form, you will need to obtain one at your own expense prior to beginning class. Cost will likely be a **MINIMUM** of \$100.

In addition, you must complete your NCS Personal Resource Questionnaire online HERE.

Plan to arrive between **9:00 a.m.** and **11:00 a.m.** (local time) on **Sunday, May 19, 2019.** Departure will be after graduation on **Saturday, May 25**, typically immediately following breakfast. If your travel schedule requires you to arrive early, Camp Crooked Creek has accommodations beginning on Saturday afternoon, May 18th and includes lodging and two meals (dinner on Saturday and breakfast on Sunday) for an additional \$55. Your council will be billed if you arrive early so be sure to consult with them prior to arriving early.

The host council has made arrangements for ground transportation from the Louisville International Airport. If you plan to travel by air you need to contact Sarah Flowers at Sarah.Flowers@Scouting.org to check on this and make arrangements for a pickup time and payment for the shuttle.

Note: Shooting Sports Section Participants – You must have NRA Rifle and Shotgun Instructor current certifications prior to your arrival. Aquatics participants – please ensure you have your lifeguard certification with you.


<u>Complete, correct BSA uniforms are required</u>. The BSA Field Uniform (Scout shorts or long trousers, Scout shirts, Scout socks) or the BSA Activity Uniform (Scout shorts or pants with Scouting golf or t-shirts) will be worn at camping school. Complete field uniform is required for evening meals, worship services, campfires, and other formal activities. (See <u>Uniform Inspection Sheet</u>.) There is not a location on site to purchase BSA uniform items so please come prepared. Housing will be in canvas tent and cots are provided. A sleep pad is recommended. Bedding and linens will not be provided. The telephone number at Camp Crooked Creek is 502-543-8722 in case of emergency.

In addition to the items listed above, please bring an open mind, a cooperative attitude, a willing smile, a lot of enthusiasm, and we'll have a great course.

Directions to Camp Crooked Creek: Take Interstate 65 South from Louisville to State Hwy. 245 (exit 112). Turn left East on Hwy. 245, proceed approximately 3/4 mile. Turn right onto Plen Mar Drive through Meadow Peak Subdivision. Go approximately 1 mile and turn left onto Terry Drive. The road ends at the camp's Administration Building.

From Nashville take I-65 N (Crossing into KENTUCKY). Take the KY- 245 exit, (EXIT 112), toward CLERMONT/BARDSTOWN. Merge onto CLERMONT RD/KY-245 toward CLERMONT/BARDSTOWN. Turn right onto Plen Mar Dr. Turn left onto Terry Drive and proceed approximately 3/4 mile.
