Roundtables may be on a district or council level, they may be in-person or virtual or a hybrid model. They may be monthly or quarterly. Councils and districts have the flexibility to create a model that maximizes participation.

To support Cub Scout Roundtables the National Cub Scouting Committee has developed a library of Cub Scout Roundtable videos that can be used to support your Cub Scout packs. These videos are 8 to 10 minutes long and cover a specific topic. At the end of each video is an opportunity for the group to discuss and share.

There are more Cub Scout Roundtable videos than there are months in the year, this is by design. We have a recommendation of which videos to show at Roundtable but the videos are also to be used by anyone working with a Cub Scout pack.



When a Cub Scout pack is having a challenge there is a good chance that there is a Cub Scout Roundtable video that will help them through this challenge. This means that in addition to showing these videos at Roundtable, you can also use them to help an individual pack. A unit commissioner may choose to show it to a pack during a pack committee meeting or a parent's meeting.

SAMPLE CUB SCOUT ROUNDTABLE TOPICS BY MONTH

JULY	Recruitment Events	This video will supplement any council's membership and recruitment plan. This video encourages packs to work with and coordinate recruitment events with their district or council.	
AUGUST	Welcoming New Families	Creating a welcoming atmosphere is something that is planned. This video walks Cub Scout leaders through things they can do to ensure when a family joins that they are welcomed.	
SEPTEMBER	Den Leader	As Den Leaders are recruited this video covers the resources available to deliver the program effectively.	
OCTOBER	Advancements	A discussion about advancement as a method of Cub Scouting. This talks about the philosophy behind advancement in Cub Scouting. It does not cover specific requirements for Advancement.	
NOVEMBER	Race Time	This covers the iconic Pinewood Derby and Raingutter Regatta and the tips and tricks to running a successful race.	
DECEMBER	Blue and Gold	Blue and Gold may not be what you think it is. This celebration is one of the oldest grassroots events in Cub Scouting. This video helps packs properly plan for their Blue and Gold.	
JANUARY	Arrow of Light to Scouts BSA	Arrow of Light Scouts should cross over into a Scouts BSA Troop in January or February. This video highlights the things that provide a smooth transition.	
FEBRUARY	Cub Scout Camping	As spring approaches this is a good time to discuss ways to plan and basic rules for Cub Scout camping.

Annual Pack Program Planning Conference

There is a training module on the details of conducting an annual program planning conference, this video highlights the basics of getting started and how to make the event special.
